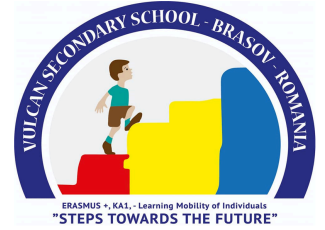


# "Eurostar" Game Instructions

## English Version



- Recommended number of players: 2-6 players.
- Recommended age: +10 years.

### Game materials

- A game board with a snake-shaped path.
- A set of cards with questions about the European Union, European countries and European projects.
- 6 pawns of different colors.
- A dice.

### Game preparing

- Each player chooses a pawn and places it at the start.
- The question cards are shuffled and placed in a pile. If the participants in the game are not of the recommended age, it is possible to eliminate the red cards that have a higher level of difficulty. Cards with a normal level of difficulty are multi-colored.

### Game progress

- The youngest player starts.
- The first player rolls the dice and the game continues in clockwise order.
- The player moves the pawn as many spaces as the dice indicates and draws a card with a question from the pack. If he/she answers the question correctly, he/she stays in place, but if he does not answer correctly, he goes back as many spaces as he moved forward.

Answers can be corrected below in the Correction Scale section.

### Special areas of the game

- The special spaces are black and come in two types: Tornado and Toboggan.
- If the pawn lands on the Tornado space, the pawn will return to the starting position.
- If the pawn lands on the Slide space, the pawn will slide onto the German flag.

### Winning the game

- The first player to reach Finish is declared the winner.
